The Autumn Program 2025 organized by the Faculty of Economics and Business, Universitas Airlangga, is an international short program themed “*Cultivating Global Citizens: Economy and Sustainability in Action.*”

Key Features of the Program

- **Duration & Venue:** Held in Surabaya, Indonesia, from 10–13 November 2025 (with arrivals on 9 November and departures on 14 November).
- **Participants:** International students who will engage in academic, cultural, and industrial activities to broaden their understanding of sustainability and global citizenship.
- **Program Components:**
 - Lectures (2 sessions):
 - Green Economy and Sustainable Business Models in Indonesia
 - Global Trade, Digital Economy, and the Path to Sustainable Development
 - Company Visits:
 - PT Petrokimia Gresik (Innovation in Sustainable Agro-Industry)
 - PT SIER (Sustainable Industrial Development: Eco-Friendly and Inclusive Economic Zones)
 - Cultural Activities: City and campus tours, ethnography museum visit, gamelan workshop, Surabaya Hero Monument and Old Town tour, and cultural performance prepared by participants.
 - Friendship & Networking: Group discussions, presentations, and buddy systems with UNAIR students.
- **Final Task:** Group project and presentation analyzing sustainability and economic practices, with outputs compiled into a program proceeding.
- **Certification:** Participants receive a Certificate of Completion (no academic grades).

In essence, the program blends academic learning, industrial exposure, cultural immersion, and collaborative projects to prepare participants as responsible and globally minded citizens.

1) How to Apply This Program?

To join this program, participants are required to complete their registration through the official link provided. By accessing the link, prospective participants can fill out the registration form accurately with the necessary personal information. This registration process serves as the first step to gaining access to the full range of program activities, so it is important to ensure that all submitted details are correct.

3) When and Where Should I Arrive?

You will be arriving at Juanda Airport in Surabaya. If you are traveling according to your group/university's arrangements, please follow their instructions. Our committee will wait for you by the exit of the arrival gate, where we will take you to the accommodation.

4) Living Expenses

Living expenses will vary depending on each student's individual lifestyle, but approximately IDR 100,000 - IDR 300,000 (€6 - €8) should be enough for one day. We recommend that you exchange sufficient currency at the airport exchange bureau or in your city.

Debit cards with the Visa or Mastercard logo can be used to make withdrawals at ATMs with the Visa or Mastercard logo throughout Indonesia with certain withdrawal fees in accordance with company regulations. You may also be able to exchange currency at banks and currency exchange providers in Surabaya.

5) Things To Do / Things To Bring

- Clothing: Participants are advised to bring a raincoat or umbrella and practical footwear. The company visit and cultural activity may involve a lot of walking, so we recommend that participants bring walking shoes and comfortable clothing.

1. **Customs and Immigration**

- a. Follow the Customs and Immigration signs.
- b. Have your passport, visa, and Arrival card ready.

2. **Baggage Claim**

- a. Head to baggage claim area to collect your belongings.
- b. Check the display screens for your flight number and carousel Information.
- c. Make sure there's nothing left behind.

3. **Currency Exchange**

- a. If you need local currency (IDR), exchange booths are located in the arrival area.

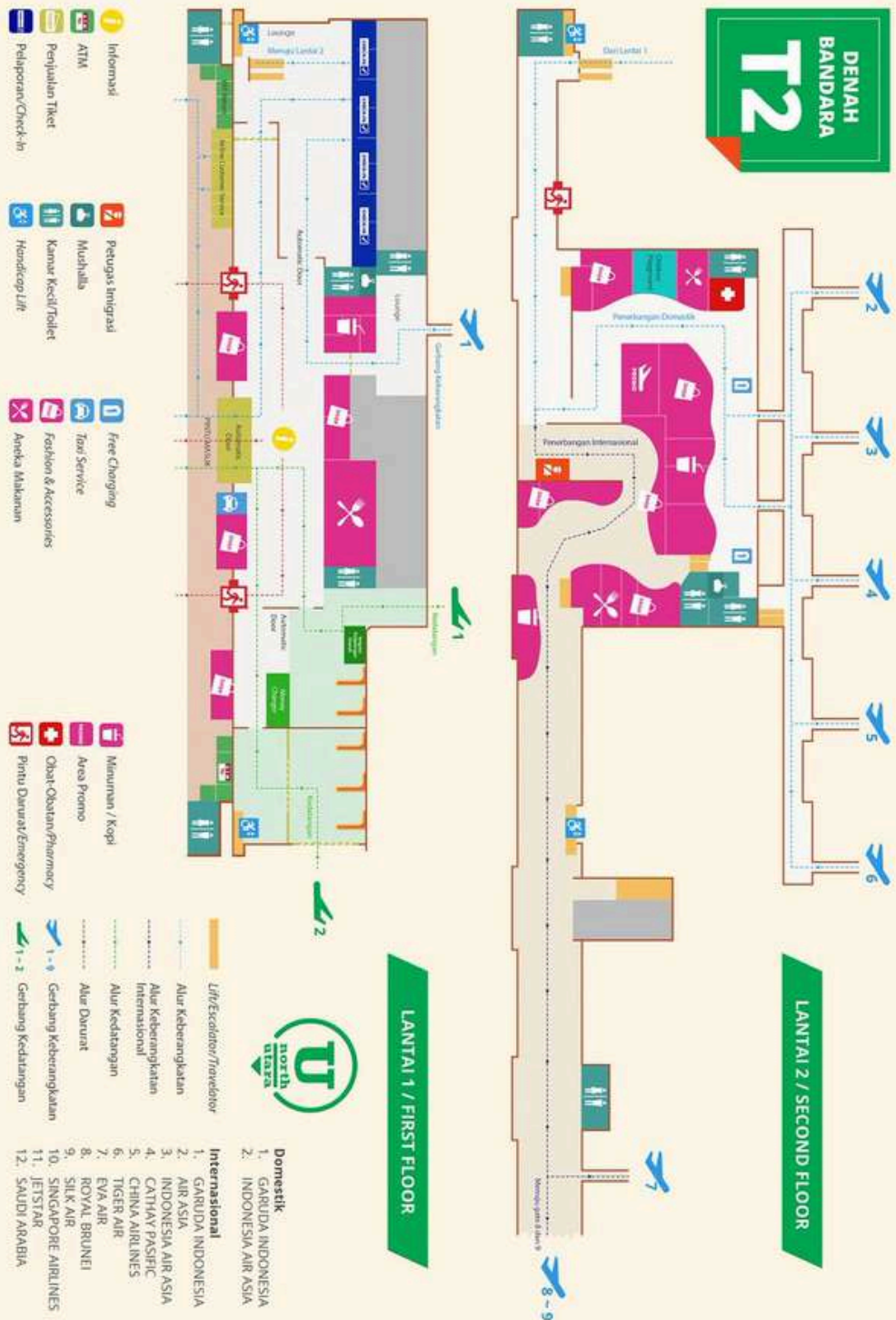
4. **City Maps and Brochures**

Physical

- Some people experience nosebleeds due to changes in weather in Indonesia.
- Since the temperature is in the range of 33-37 degrees Celsius, some people will experience redness on the skin. Thus, bring and apply your sunscreen.
- Since Indonesia is a tropical country, there are many common animals living around, such as mosquitoes and flies. Use your lotion in order to avoid bugs bites.
- High pollution levels in industrial areas may cause problems for asthmatics.
- Indonesian foods are typically spicy. You may inform the committee if you prefer less-spicy food.
- Some beverages contain strong seasoning that may cause diarrhea. Thus, you are advised to bring your own personal medication.

Cultural

- Indonesians are interested in international people. Locals might want to pose for a picture with you
- Traffic jams are everywhere. Thus, be aware of rush hours when you are planning to go out.
- As part of the Indonesian culture, some places may encourage eating with your hands. Restaurants will always provide you with utensils.
- Toilet paper may not be readily available in restrooms. Thus, you may bring some with you if you'd like.
- Indonesia is the largest muslim country in the world, so expect prayer calls 5 times per day.



What to Do?

- Respect every activity that takes place in several areas in Surabaya (religious activities that are usually carried out every week, month, or year by people of several religions in Surabaya)
- Learn about the culture, traditions, and local wisdom in Surabaya (activities carried out from time immemorial in every important moment)
- Have a polite and courteous attitude (apply a polite and courteous attitude in daily activities, especially for those who are elderly)
- Say 3 simple words (Say "Please" when asking for something or help, say "Sorry" if you feel there is a mistake, and say "Thank you" if you get something from other people no matter how small it is)
- Do 3 simple habits (Doing "3S": Senyum, Salam, Sapa) to other people who interact with you every day)

Not to Do

- Ignoring dress etiquette
- Consuming alcohol or having bad habits in public places (Doesn't respect the surrounding community who are carrying out activities)
- Doing acts of social violence, sexual violence, etc. to the surrounding community (Not doing obscene things and doing things outside of normal limits)
- Ignoring environmental cleanliness (Not practicing good habits as a Foreign Citizen living in another country, especially in Surabaya)

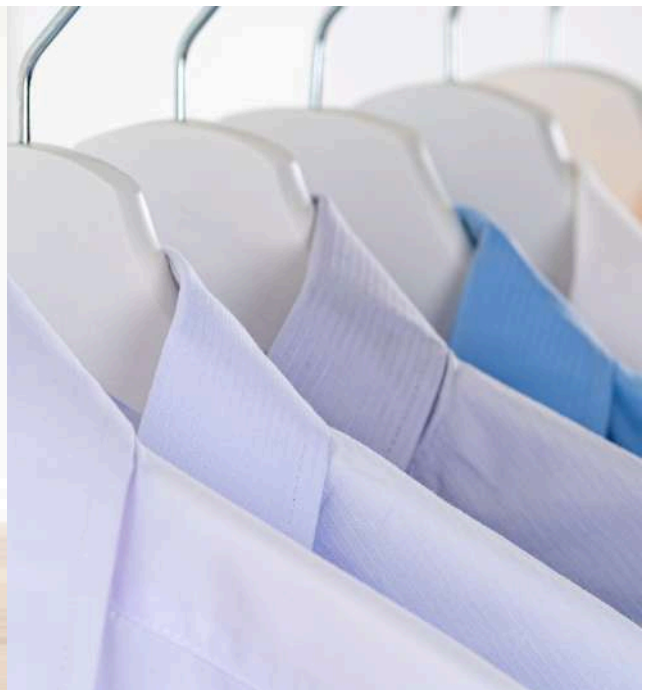

Convenience Store

There are various convenience stores in Indonesia such as Indomaret and Alfamart. They are stocked with a wide variety of prepared foods, snacks, beverages, and daily necessities. There are Indomarets and Alfamarts close to the hotel that are open 24-hours and campus that is open from 07:00 - 23:00.



Internet Access

The university provides a campus wireless network that you can use.

Meals

HEALTH & SAFETY



- Participants must prepare their own travel/health insurance that covers medical treatment overseas.
- Participants should bring any personal medication and keep themselves hydrated all-day.
- UNAIR has an on-campus medical clinic and university hospital which provide general and dental treatment. Participants who would like to use these facilities should pay for their own expenses.
- Participants should have important personal belongings with themselves or keep them in a secure place where possible.



PAYMENT METHOD



Many ATMs accept cards that are issued outside of Indonesia as long as it has the logo of Visa or MasterCard. Exchange rates offered at ATMs tend to be competitive, but service fees vary widely depending on the card.



Indonesia has a reputation for being a cash-based society.

The Indonesian currency is Rupiah (Rp/IDR). Bills come in 1.000, 2.000, 5.000, 10.000, 20.000, 50.000, 75.000, and 100.000 IDR. Coins come in 100, 200, 500, and 1.000 IDR.

Etnographic Museum UNAIR



The Ethnographic Museum was established on September 25, 2005, coinciding with the founding date of the Department of Anthropology at the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Universitas Airlangga (FISIP UNAIR). The inception of the Ethnographic Museum was motivated by the extensive collection owned by one of the pioneers of Physical Anthropology at FISIP UNAIR, Dr. A. Adi Sukadana, who frequently conducted excavations in the context of physical anthropology. These findings were eventually gathered and stored at the Department of Anthropology, which ultimately led to the establishment of the Ethnographic Museum.

Gamelan



The gamelan is a traditional ensemble of musical instruments from Indonesia that creates intricate patterns of sound when played together. It is an important part of Indonesian culture and is associated with traditional ceremonies, festivals, and cultural events. The music style and ensemble can vary depending on the region it is performed in. Gamelan is composed of percussion and other instruments, including metallophones, xylophones, aerophones, chordophones, and vocals. It is part of the art of karawitan music, and is played by musicians called wiyaga who use hammers and their hands to play the instruments.

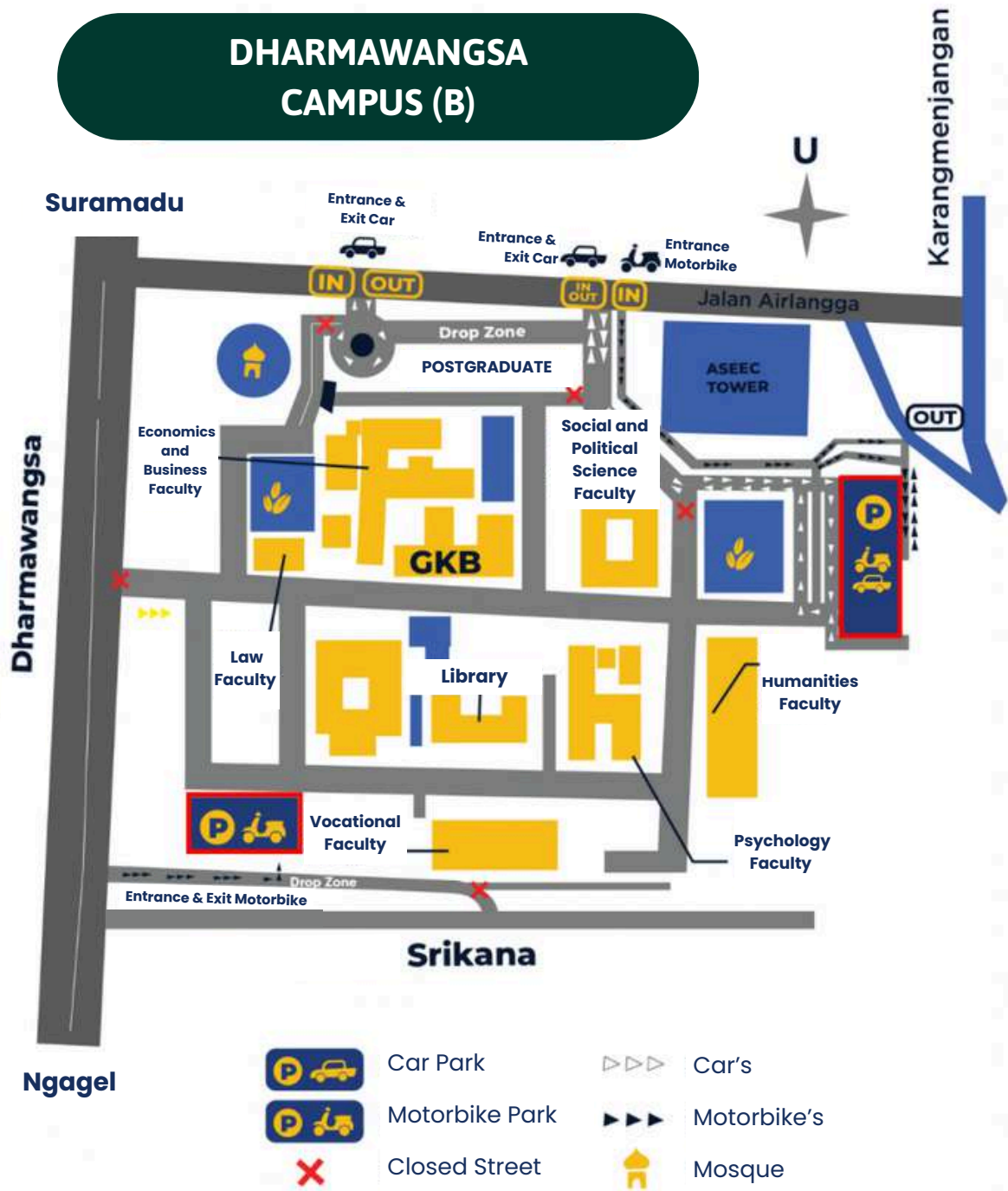
