Requirement	We do not require students to submit a language proficiency certificate upon arrival. However, we recommend language proficiency levels for our inbound exchange students to ensure a positive cultural exchange experience. - For English-taught programs: Minimum scores are TOEFL ITP 457, TOEFL iBT 57, IELTS 4.0, or TOEIC 550. - For non-English programs: Minimum scores are CEFR A2, TOCFL Level 2, HSK 2, or equivalent proficiency in a similar test.
